THE GIFT OF GOD THAT IS FAITH

All of us have something of Thomas in us: 'Unless I see the holes the nails made and can put my fingers in the holes ... I refuse to believe.' Although when Jesus appeared again, and Thomas was there, it was enough to see Jesus. He didn't need to touch him.

Because of the trust we had in the persons who taught us the rudiments of our faith --- our parents, the priests, nuns, brothers or Sunday School teachers, we came to believe. It was a gradual process as we grew to realise the elements of our religion. For most of us it was all a part of our growing up and our education.

Essentially, this came about because of the trust we had in our parents and other teachers.

Because we can't see what we believe, we are living and acting by faith, and it necessarily involves an act of our will --- that we choose to do so. That is as it seems to us. But the belief and the involvement of our will requires a gift of God's grace.

Periodically, we meet people we do not believe but wish they could. They may tell us they envy us our faith. We can only suggest they pray, asking God to give them the gift of faith and pray for them ourselves.

I have found that if they refuse to ask God's help and insist, they must work it out themselves. They will remain faith-less. Invariably, if they attempt some form of prayers, God will give them that initial foundational grace.


